Motion-That the Commission approve payment of the E-ZPass Interagency Group's invoice for expenses incurred in supporting the backup Virtual Private Network (VPN), for the period January 2024 through May 2024, in the amount of \$4,168.44 -was made by Commissioner Deon, seconded by Commissioner Logan, and passed unanimously.

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AGREEMENTS

Motion-That the Commission approve the negotiation and execution of the Agreements and an Amendment for the items listed in memos "a" and "b":

- Four (4) Agreements for fabricated structural steel shop inspections (January 2025 December 2029), utilizing the Commonwealth's contracts with PennDOT selected vendors; at a total not-to-exceed amount of \$8,000,000.00;

Motion–That the Commission approve the Acquisition of Right-of-Way #7077-E (4800 Street Road LLC), a partial take parcel necessary for construction of the I-95A, Ramp D project, by authorizing payment of \$275,476.07 representing fair market value, pro-rated taxes and recording fees to Diversified Settlement Services, Inc., as escrow agent; authorize the appropriate Commission officials to execute the agreement of sale and other documents that may be required for closing, authorize the payment of additional statutory damages as calculated by the Right-of-Way Administrator and approved by the Chief Counsel; and payment of fair market value to the property owner is contingent upon the delivery of a deed as prepared by the Legal Department-was made by Commissioner Deon, seconded by Commissioner Logan, and passed unanimously.

Motion-That the Commission approves the negotiation and execution of Supplemental Agreement #2 for Contract #M-052.50X002 for final design environmental activities for the Mon/Fayette Expressway, Rt. 51 to I-376, with McCormick Taylor, for an extended project design duration that necessitates additional coordination and studies, permitting component adjustments due to regulatory changes and updates; for an additional \$2,500,000.00, for a revised not-to-exceed amount of \$14,500,000.00-was made by Commissioner Deon, seconded by Commissioner Logan, and passed unanimously.

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SUPPLEMENTAL ADVISORY POOL

Motion-That the Commission approves amending the Supplemental Advisory Services pool of qualified firms to provide performance audits, forensic audits, best practices, advisory services, compliance assessments and specialized security and investigation services, to include Cathedral Pines, LLC; and authorize the appropriate Commission officials to execute the agreement-was made by Commissioner Deon, seconded by Commissioner Logan, and passed unanimously.
